Submarine – a vessel designed to operate underwater, using controlled buoyancy to dive and surface.

U-boat – a German military submarine used especially during the World Wars to attack ships and disrupt supply routes.

Trident – the United Kingdom's nuclear submarine system, which operates continuously at sea as part of its defence strategy.

Subway – an underground railway system used for public transport in large cities.

Sub (sandwich) – a long sandwich made with a roll shaped like a submarine, often filled with meats, cheese, and vegetables.

Subscription – a payment model in which users pay regularly to access a product or service rather than owning it.

Subscriber – a person who signs up and pays for ongoing access to a service or product.

Substitute (sub) – a person who replaces another, commonly used in sport for a player who comes on during a match.

Super sub – a substitute player who has a particularly strong or game-changing impact.

Suburb – a residential area located on the outskirts of a city, often quieter than the centre.

Suburban – relating to or characteristic of suburbs and their lifestyle.

Sub-zero – a temperature below zero, often associated with extreme cold.

Subtle – something delicate or not immediately obvious; the “b” is silent in pronunciation.

Subconscious – the part of the mind that influences behaviour without conscious awareness.

Submerge – to go or put something under water.

Subsurface – existing or occurring beneath the surface.

Substandard – below the expected or required level of quality.

Subheading – a smaller title within a larger section of text.
